

## gender based violence online - bingo

time - 15/30 minutes

### Purpose

To sharpen the students' awareness of the types of hate they experience in their daily lives and open up a conversation about where they typically encounter it and in what contexts.

### Activity description

Bingo is a classroom activity designed to create a shared focus on the types of hate students experience in their daily lives. Bingo cards are printed out for all the students in the class. The teacher reads out a statement, and the students should cover the statement with a piece of paper if they have encountered that type of online behaviour in the last six months.

#### Attention!

As this activity contains some statements that might lead to disclosures, we have included advice on how to handle disclosures:

- When a young person discloses something significant, remain **calm** and composed. Your reaction can influence how the youth feels about sharing their experience.
- Offer **reassurance** that the young person is not alone and that you are there to help
- **Protect** the youths **privacy** and avoid asking the young person to elaborate further in front of the rest of the class. Thank them for sharing their experience and say that you would like to talk more about it later. It is, of course, crucial that you follow up and make sure to have a more private conversation afterward.
- Familiarise yourself with and follow the **safeguarding and reporting procedures** of your organisation.
- **Report** the disclosure according to your specific procedures.
- After reporting, continue to offer **emotional support**. Maintain an open line of communication, and ensure the youth have access to support services if needed.

### Reflections during and after the challenge:

- How many of the above have you experienced?
- Can you give other examples?
- Do boys, girls, and non-binary individuals experience specific types of hatred?
- Is there a difference in how often boys, girls, and non-binary individuals experience things described here?
- Is there a difference in how boys, girls, and non-binary individuals experience it when it happens?

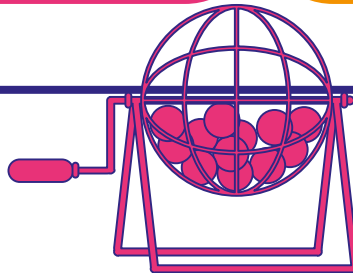
